APPLES

ENTERPRISE: Developed by Purdue University, this is a late-maturing, deep red apple with good keeping qualities. Fruit is uniform and medium to large in size. Tree is vigorous and spreading, with good annual

bearing habits. Enterprise™ is **highly resistant to fire blight and cedar apple rust**. Pollinators: All apples listed (*Semi-Dwarf*)

HONEYCRISP: The fruit is mostly orange-red with a yellow background. This crisp, juicy, sweet-tart apple has a rich flavor that has made it #1 in taste panels. The fruit averages 3 inches and stores well. Outstanding winter hardiness. Honeycrisp is moderately **resistant to apple scab**. Tree is non-vigorous and late blooming. Great for eating fresh. Pollinators: All apples listed (*Semi-Dwarf*)

GOLDRUSH: Best known for its remarkable keeping qualities, GoldRush will keep in regular cold storage approximately 10 or 11 months. Fruit is crisp and tart off the tree and develops its sugars in storage. GoldRush resists oxidation when cut, making a nice, yellow sauce, and the fruit also bakes very well. **Resistant to scab** and mildew. Pollinators: All apples listed (*Semi-Dwarf*)



PEACHES

CONTENDER: A high-quality, freestone variety. Fruit is very firm and large with excellent color. The trees are hardy and very productive. Pollinators:

Self-fertile (*Standard, Height max 10ft*)

CORALSTAR®: A is a large, beautiful freestone peach with 80 percent red color. The flesh is firm with wonderful flavor. It holds well on the tree and in storage and does not brown when cut. **Resistant to bacterial spot**. Pollinators: Self-fertile (*Standard, Height max 10ft*)

FLAMIN' FURY: Fruit is very large and highly colored. Harvests the same season as Loring. Tree is productive and blooms a little later, making it more tolerant to spring frost damage. A high **degree of resistance to bacterial spot**. Pollinators: Self-fertile (*Standard, Height max 10ft*)



CHERRIES

BALATON® (tart): A late maturing tart cherry ripening about seven to ten days after Montmorency. The fruit is large and very firm

with a red juicy flesh. This is a very high-quality tart cherry selection and is recommended for fresh markets, processing and the home garden. Pollinator: Self-fertile (*Standard, Height max 15-20ft*)

MONTMORENCY (tart): The most popular cherry in the USA! It bears armloads of ripe, tangy, red cherries, which make mouthwatering, succulent pies and cobbles. Cold-hardy. Ripens in mid-June. Pollinator: Self-fertile. (*Standard, Height max 15-20ft*)

SKEENA™ (sweet): Skeena™ is an excellent dark sweet cherry that shows good tolerance to splitting from the rain. It ripens a couple weeks after Bing. The fruit is large, attractive and excellent eating. Pollinator: Self-fertile. (*Standard, Height max 15-20ft*)

STELLA (sweet): A Dark Sweet Cherry is a large, good quality fruit from vigorous and productive trees. Pollinator: Self-fertile. (*Standard, Height max 15-20ft*)



ASPARAGUS

JERSEY KNIGHT: High yields! Extra large, uniform, tender spears. Good for fresh eating, cooking or making salads. Matures from early April through mid-May. Cold-hardy and heat-tolerant. Sold in package of 10 plants.



BLUEBERRIES

BLUERAY: An early mid season berry. The fruit is very large and firm, but softens quickly which limits shipping value. It produces an aromatic flavor good for pies and jam. The clusters are large and very tight. The bush is vigorous and productive. Self-pollinator.

TOP HAT: Perfect for **container gardening**. Compact plant size at 2 ft by 2 ft with full size, firm, flavorful fruits- perfect for fresh eating. Late ripening in August. Self-pollinator.

PATRIOT: Quarter-size berries! Big and bountiful, this is the largest early-season blueberry around. Berries have outstanding flavor and are super-hardy. A landscape bonus: snowy blossoms in early summer, stunning orange leaves in fall. Plant multiplies for the largest fruit. Self-pollinator.



STRAWBERRIES

ALLSTAR: Allstar is a top-performing strawberry! Berries are large, glossy, firm and exhibit that perfect strawberry shape. And sweet--so sweet. If you love to freeze strawberries or make

preserves, then plant plenty of extras. This easy care strawberry is highly disease resistant and very vigorous. Ripens mid-season. Sold in packages of 25 plants.

EARLIGLOW: Many consider Earliglow berries to be the BEST FLAVORED of all the widely grown commercial varieties. It is the earliest producing with medium sized berries. It is the max for fresh out of the garden eating, jams and freezing. so sweet no sugar is needed. Earliglow is one of the most widely planted. Sold in packages of 25 plants.



BLACKBERRIES

TRIPLE CROWN: The plants yield large, glossy black fruits that are pleasantly firm. A tasty blend of sweetness and tartness. Fruit ripens from about mid July to mid August. Plants can be trellised or grown upright. Heat-tolerant.

Self-pollinating. Sold in packages of 2 plants.

PRIME ARK FREEDOM: Harvest berries with ease from thornless, upright canes. Primocanes fruit first, followed by a second crop on older canes. Fruit is large, firm, and sweet. Disease-resistant to rust. Everbearing primocane. Early season. Drought tolerant. Cold-hardy. Ripens in July until frost. Self-pollinating. Sold in packages of 2 plants.



RASPBERRIES

HERITAGE RED: Harvest raspberries your very first year. Produces big crops of large, sweet, dark red berries in June, then repeats in September. Perfect for eating fresh, canning, freezing, jams and jellies. Self-supporting upright canes, tolerance for poor soil. Needs a well-drained spot. Sold in packages of 2 plants.

NIWOT (BLACK): Primocanes produce berries in the fall, ripening over 3-4 weeks or until frost beginning in late August - early September. The following year, those canes will have a summer crop of medium to large berries giving **2 years of berries unlike standard varieties**. The fall berries are a little larger than Jewel. Niwot is quite vigorous. Sold in packages of 2 plants.



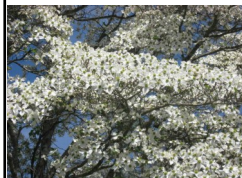
ARONIA/BLACK CHOKEBERRY

NERO: They are the size of a common lilac bush relatively pest or disease free. Needs sun to part shade and is adaptable to low, wet or sandy areas as well as dry areas. The blueberry size fruit is tasty eaten fresh. Used to make a nutritious juice and as a stable, natural food coloring. Abundant showy white flowers in the spring are followed in the fall by large jet black berries and brilliant, fire-red foliage. Mature Height: 3-4 feet

NATIVE TREES



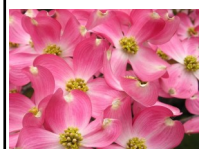
BEAUTY BERRY BUSH: In spring it blooms precious pinkish lavender flowers similar to lilacs. When autumn comes, the leaves turn a lovely yellow chartreuse color, and in winter the bush with its bright purple or white berries decorates your house. They appreciate some shade so full sun not being a necessity makes them easier to grow. Mature height: can reach 8 feet



WHITE DOGWOOD : This dogwood is an ornamental tree popular for its numerous white flowers that bloom in the spring and leaves that turn purplish red in the fall. This tree will be nearly 25 feet and it prefers full sun or partial shade and moist climates. Mature height: 20-35 feet.



PINK DOGWOOD : It will erupt in tiny pink to pinkish-red flowers in April. In the fall, dark green leaves will turn shades of red and purple. In the winter, it will grow a bright red fruit on gray stems. The fruit is inedible to people. It should be planted in full sun. Mature height: 20-35 feet.



RED DOGWOOD : In the spring the tree blooms with an abundance of reddish-deep pink flowers, the leaves are also a reddish color, and in the spring red fruits add a splash of color. It grows to a height of 25 feet. It enjoys at least five hours of sun per day and prefers rich, well-drained soil. Mature height: 20-35 feet.



SWEET BAY MAGNOLIA TREE: Blooms in early spring. They produce large, elegant, white flowers that release a sweet floral scent. A magnolia tree produces leaves that are large and glossy and change from brilliant shades of red in the spring to tints of green in the summer to yellow or brown tones in the fall. Mature height: 10-35 feet



COMMON LILAC: They provide splashes of vibrant color and a robust pleasant fragrance that peaks in late summer. For best results plant in the fertile ground, that is well-drained in full sunlight. Mature height: 8-20 feet

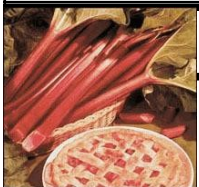


REDBUD: This small, beautiful tree is a highlight of spring. Blooming in early spring with clusters of dark pink-to-lavender flowers, its color is outstanding. Redbud is a short-lived tree that occurs on rich, upland soils. This understory tree often forms a distinct stand in association with larger species. Mature Height: 20-30 feet



RED SUNSET MAPLE: This tree is so adaptable and easy to work with. In the summer and spring, the tree has gorgeous bright green foliage and makes a super shade tree. The months of autumn are when this tree puts on a show of color. The leaf is a brilliant shade of fiery red that helps this tree stand out in the landscape. Mature Height: 20-30 feet

RHUBARB



CRIMSON RED: This variety is considered by some to be the best flavored rhubarb available with a perfect sweet, tart combination that makes rhubarb so appealing. The stalks will grow about two feet tall and produce good yields of fleshy stalks that are not stringy. Crimson Red shows good weather hardiness and is adaptable to many soil types and growing conditions.
